“Sacrificed Remembered”

An invitation from Bishop Alastair to contribute to a publication and display on the First World War

Bishop Alastair writes *“In this year of commemoration we should remember the great sacrifice of the men, women and children of our communities; both home and overseas. The First World War cost the future of so many and continues to be a terrible reminder of the worse that humanity can do to itself. This centenary affords us space to think seriously about some of the major themes that warfare and peace-making bring.”*

In order to consider the First World War more personally the Diocese is running a project to publish a book which will be written largely by the people of our churches, our visitors and the wider community. The book will be called “Sacrificed Remembered”. In that book we hope many people will share their own reflections on the great themes of the First World War.

I therefore invite you to reflect and offer your own thoughts on the four themes of the book; Conflict, Peace, Resolution and Hope. Hopefully, as you offer your reflections, this book will become a lasting memory and legacy of this moment of commemoration.”
