We got to bless Keith and his wife with just a small act of kindness and faith before Keith sadly passed away. Last week the youth brought a bouquet of flowers for Keith's widow and found it very humbling to be invited inside by Will the son, where we told them that they were in the church's thoughts and we also offered to pray for them at any time.

People's responses are really varied. Some can't quite believe they're getting something for free and are quite touched when we tell them we just wanted to bless them. Others are a little bit suspicious but overall it's been fantastic to do. We have also managed to talk about the youth mission work in Uganda and China.

The youth, I have to say, are fearless in the Lord by knocking on doors and just talking to people. They're truly amazing. I just wish that you guys could be invisible for twenty minutes just to see them in action. When we first went out we know you all prayed for us and we always pray before we go to the houses just outside the church door. Just to hear the prayers of the youth is just so incredibly humbling.

So thanks again for your prayers for the youth and support for this work. I know we will never really know what impact we will have doing this, but when you go out with faith and kindness for some people it will really touch their hearts. To be frank, I can think of nothing worse than belonging to an aloof uncaring insular church, and I would imagine that a lot of local people think that. But as a youth group we are determined to reach out and demonstrate in action the love of Jesus to the local community. It might take a while, and this is only the first faltering steps, but it's worth it.
