In preparation for the Heritage Open Day on September 12th I have been doing some research on interesting events in Hartshorne as reported in the newspapers of the day. I was very excited when I came across this interesting item:

THE DERBY MERCURY

April 26, 1865

HARTSHORNE

On Wednesday last the new Girls' School-room, in this village, was opened. The day's proceedings commenced with an excellent sermon, by the Rev. A. Cave, M.A., after full choral service by the justly celebrated choir, who more than equalled their previous efforts, and gave (after the Third Collect) a very fine anthem by Dr. Nares, in which the solo parts were taken, and beautifully sung by Miss Buckley and a young lady member of the choir) whose name we could not learn. The children of both schools, mounting to 173, were, after the service, marshalled in procession down the village to the new school-room, where they were regaled with plenty of roast beef and plum-pudding, at the expense of a worthy rector. A handsome and substantial luncheon was provided at the Rectory for friends who had assisted in the morning's proceedings; and after the party had separated, the spacious school-room was opened for the purpose of a dance, to which members of the choir had alone the privilege of granting invitations, their exertions having been

(as the Rector remarked in a very touching and appropriate address he delivered to the children before their dinner) the cause (under God's blessing) of this handsome building being erected, and the liberal sum they had earned by their capital concerts, the nucleus of the sum raised for its completion. We gladly add that the merry-makers knew how to be both merry and wise, as not a single case of drunkenness or disorderly conduct occurred to mar the happiness of the evening. Many of the neighbouring gentry visited Hartshorne on this interesting occasion; and the principal farmers were also present.

It was good to receive a telephone call from a couple, Caroline and David, who wanted to thank us for all the hard work that has been done in the churchyard.



SEATING IN THE BALCONY

A few weeks ago Barian was up in the balcony and noticed that from wherever he sat he could see the pulpit. He had a strong conviction that the balcony needed to be made more comfortable and that once again it would filled when the seats were all occupied in the nave. He wanted to provide seating pads to put on the hard wooden benches and was quite prepared to pay to have these professionally made. This would be a vast improvement on the carpet samples currently being used. However, after sharing his vision with Bill, he was amazed when Bill offered to make the seating pads if he purchased the materials. So Bill has been busy sewing over the past few weeks and on Friday fitted the pads. They look fantastic! Please go up in the balcony and have a look for yourself. A big thank you to Brian and Bill.



You might wonder where the wooden benches came from. It is thought that when the church was enlarged in 1835 some of the old benches were moved up into the newly built balcony. You will notice that the first bench that you come to at the top of the stairs has carving inside the backrest. We have been told that this bench is Jacobean (1603-1625).
