More items of interest from local newspapers from the past:

THE TAMWORTH HERALD

SEPT 2, 1876

SWADLINCOTE PETTY SESSIONS, THURSDAY, August 24th

William *****, of Hartshorne, was charged by John William Morley, farmer, of the same place, with stealing six hen eggs, his property, on the 8th inst. The defendant was seen by Morley in one of his grass fields, where the hens usually laid their eggs. He took one nest, containing six eggs, and then ran away. Committed to gaol for seven days.

THE DERBYSHIRE ADVERTISER AND JOURNAL August 1st 1862

HARTSHORNE.

In the above village rather a serious accident occurred on Thursday week. As some men in the employ of Mr. Bidulph were mowing in a field, one of them got his foot in a hole, which caused him to fall upon the point of his scythe, which entered his side a considerable depth, causing the blood to flow profusely. The Rev. W. Chapman, of Melbourne, who was visiting an afflicted person in a house opposite, observed the men running together, and went to their assistance. He found the poor man sadly wounded. He was, as soon as possible, removed to his home in a cart, and Dr. Hall, of Swadlincote, was summoned to attend him, and in his care we believe he is now recovering.

An advertisement for excursions to North Wales featured in the same 1862 newspaper. The **North Staffordshire Railway (NSR)** was formed in 1845 to promote a number of lines in Staffordshire, Cheshire, Derbyshire and Shropshire. 25 shillings in 1862 would be worth about £100 today so not as cheap as the coach trips on offer nowadays!

These Tickets (NOT TRANSFERABLE) are available by all Passenger Trains on the North Staffordshire Railway, and enable the holders to break the journey (either going or returning) at any Station on the Chester and Holyhead Line, between Chester, inclusive, and the Station for which the Ticket is taken.

Passengers wishing to stay at any of the above places for a longer period than that for which the Ticket is issued can do so by paying 10 per cent. additional on the price of the Ticket, for the first Fortnight or portion of a Fortnight, and 5 per cent. more on the price of the Ticket, for each week or portion of a week after the first Fortnight; but the time will in no case be extended beyond the 31st December, 1862. Application for extension of time is to be made to the Station from which the Return Ticket is available, in all cases not later than on the day on which the term of the Ticket expires.
