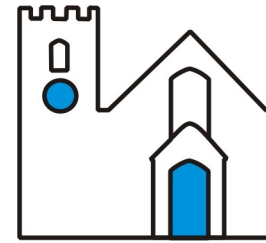

From the newspaper archives ...

DERBYSHIRE ADVERTISER AND JOURNAL
SEPT. 30, 1864

HARTSHORNE.

The first stone of the new school room for girls was laid on Wednesday last, by Mrs. Henry Buckley, in the presence of a numerous concourse of spectators who had assembled to witness the ceremony. Divine service commenced at three o'clock, and was most impressively conducted by the much beloved Rector reading the prayers, and the sermon being preached by the Rev. Dr. Pears, of Repton. The rev. gentleman took his text from the 144th Psalm, verse 12, and pointed out very plainly and ably the privileges and duties flowing out of the position which women held in every civilized nation, and urged upon all present the necessity of procuring a sound Christian education for those who are in their turn destined to be wives and mothers, and so to have much influence for good or for evil. The admirable choir kept up most fully its well deserved reputation; Jackson's Evening Services were performed with a precision which is unheard of in a cathedral, and the manner in which the singers pronounce their words is truly excellent and entirely free from all provincial accent. The Anthem was from the 150th Psalm and was quite a musical treat, so delightfully was it sung and with so

much attention to light and shade. After a few prayers from our incomparable liturgy, the stone was laid by Mrs. Buckley, and the ceremony of the day terminated by the choir singing the 100th Psalm, in which many of the spectators heartily joined in. The Woodville Band gave their services gratis, and played with much spirit several favourite airs whilst the very prettily arranged procession was wending its way from the church to the site of the schools. A large party from the Rectory attended, amongst whom were the Rev. T. W. and the Misses Whitaker, Rev. Ambrose and Mrs. Cave; Rev. J. R. and Mrs Stevens; Mr., Mrs., and the Misses Smith. of Shellbrook House; the Misses Gordon; Mr. and Mrs. Bangham; Mrs. Mammatt and Miss Buller ; Mr. and Mrs. Richard Thompson, of Woodville; Captain Buckley; Mr. and Mrs. Ratcliff, of Littlethorn House; Mr. and Miss Mellor; Miss Brown and the young ladies of the choir. The inhabitants of the village also mustered in large numbers, amongst the oldest and most respected of whom were Mr. and Miss Mansfield, Mr. and Mrs. Lowe, Mr. and Mrs. Brown, Mr. and Mrs. Orme, Messrs. Brynd, Startin, Mellor, Kendrick, etc. The collection amounted to upwards of £11, previous large subscriptions having been raised amongst the parishioners and from many occupying land in the parish but non-resident.
