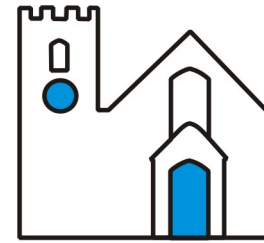

Here is some information about Charles Buckley, which shows how well thought of he was in the village.

**HARTSHORNE.**

It will doubtless be fresh to the memory of many of our readers, that about five years ago the late lamented Prince Albert presented Charles Edward Buckley, Esq., (the only son of the rector of this parish), with a commission in the Rifle Brigade, and after serving at Aldershot Camp for a few months, he, with his battalion, was ordered to India to assist in quelling the mutiny in that country. He was present at the memorable siege of Lucknow, and several other engagements of less note, but fortunately escaped without ever being hit, excepting a heavy blow on the arm from a musket by a Sepoy. It became known on Monday week, by electric telegraph, that he would be expected here on that evening, when several hundred persons, to whom his name and person are very familiar, assembled near the rectory, to give this young hero a hearty reception, which was done as few but Englishmen know how. When he alighted from the carriage a most affecting scene was witnessed. He was

met at the entrance hall by the rector and family, who were so overcome as to be unable to speak or move for many seconds, and many of the bystanders were in the same predicament. Well may the worthy pastor be proud of such a son. We might relate many acts of open-heartedness and generosity which reflect great credit on so young a man, as well as acts of bravery in the field of battle under great perils, in the discharge of his duty, but which perhaps would be thought out of place in a public journal.

**HARTSHORNE.**

To celebrate the return from India of Charles Edward Buckley, Esq., which was noted in last week's paper, a family party was entertained at the Rectory, on Wednesday se'nnight, the early part of which was occupied in the performance of a selection of sacred and secular music, which added considerably to the hilarity of the company. After supper, which, was of the usual excellent kind and of abundances without excess, the evening was enlivened by the young soldier, who related many amusing and instructive narratives of Indian life, and, by request, gave a vivid description of the siege of Lucknow, at which he, with his regiment, acted a prominent part. Not the least amused among the company was the youthful warrior himself, whose good-tempered looking face and hearty laugh showed unmistakable symptoms of enjoyment, particularly when his memory was refreshed with the exploits of his younger days.
