FOOD BANK COLLECTION POINT

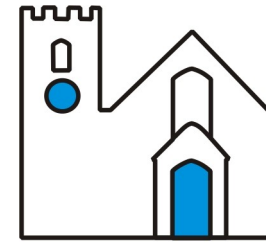
We now have a permanent collection point at church so that we can support the Swadlincote Food Bank throughout the year.

From the church magazine July 1904

THE arrangements for our Festival Sunday, July 3rd, being the Sunday within the octave of St. Peter's Day, the Apostle and Martyr to whom our Church is dedicated, are as follows :—

8 a.m. — Holy Communion.

11 a.m. — Matins and Holy Communion.

3 p.m. — Flower Service.

6.30 p.m. — Evensong & Sermon.

SUNDAY SCHOOL TREAT. It was decided this year to take our Sunday School to Bretby Park, by the kind permission of the Earl of Carnarvon. So having borrowed waggons from many kind friends, and hired a brake to take those who wished to accompany us, we started from the Schools with flags waving at 2 p.m. Permission had been given to enter the Park at the upper gates, so that the children might have a longer drive, which made us a little late in arriving; but we did enjoy the afternoon. Mr. and Mrs. Wain did everything to make us happy, and many willing helpers prepared an abundant tea, which, being soon ready, was thoroughly enjoyed by the little ones, to say nothing of the grown up. After tea, Mr. Hayward assembled the children and ran the races with much energy and zest. The only drawback to a complete enjoyment of the day, was the absence of our Rector. It is the first time he has ever been away at our S.S.T., and we hope it will be the last, but we were glad to have Mrs. Reade, who helped us all to feel his loss less. About 7 p.m. Mrs. Reade gave away the prizes (many of which had been sent by Miss Lloyd, and were much appreciated) to the successful winners. It would take too long to describe all the enjoyments of

this happy afternoon. We can only say that seldom have we had such a happy day, not only as a Sunday School Treat, but as a united gathering, for all took such an interest and helped so heartily that everything went off well. We have many to thank for their kind help, especially Mr. and Mrs. Orme, all the teachers, Mr. J. Jones and Mr. W. Dawson, Mrs. Williams and Mrs. Orme for presents of sweets, and all those who so kindly lent their waggons; also Mrs. Wilkinson and those who laboured so hard at preparing the tea. On our way home we were much delighted to see the Hartshorne Band, who kindly came out to meet us and played the happy procession into the village. Stopping at the Schools, very hearty cheers were given for the Rector and Mrs. Reade, and for all helpers. The Band then struck up, "God save the King," and all went on their homeward ways, perhaps a bit tired, but with very thankful hearts. We must not forget to mention the cricket match which was played by our boys against Bretby, and after a good game, was won by Hartshorne S.S.
