FOOD BANK COLLECTION POINT

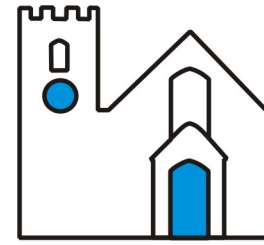
We now have a permanent collection point at church so that we can support the Swadlincote Food Bank throughout the year.

MOTHERS' MEETING The Mothers' Meeting Treat took place on Monday, July 18, and a very happy party started in two brakes at 9.30 that morning. The weather was perfect, a fresh breeze blowing to temper the heat of the sun, and we all thoroughly enjoyed the lovely drive, and the scent of the hay and the wild roses as we went along.

We passed through Coleorton, and looked up the narrow flowery path leading to the church, half hidden in trees, but had no time to stop and explore its beauties. Then we passed through Gracedieu, and as we read the name on the sign-post gave a thought to the French fugitives who settled there so long ago, and called the pleasant English place, where they had at last found rest, Grace a Dieu in thanksgiving.

At last we arrived at our destination, Burleigh Brook, and though the grass lawns were much burnt up it still looked very attractive. The tea room was covered with roses, and a pleasant pool with two majestic swans on it attracted us at once. We found out afterwards the swans were made of cardboard, and from between their wings the boatmen steered happy parties round and round the Island, and we felt we had embarked on a dangerous voyage. Some of us screamed aloud at first, fearing the perils of the deep. Then there were switchback railways and swings for the adventurous.

But before enjoying all these we went into the rose-covered tea house and had lunch and hot tea—most refreshing, and then set off walking to see the pretty little town of Loughborough, about a mile distant—and a very hot mile, too, in the blazing

sun. We must not enlarge on all its charms and the many delightful things to be bought for 2¾d., &c. Some of us went into the beautiful church and rested in its cool aisles for a time, and looked at the quaint old brasses and many other interesting things.

Half-past three found us seated round the tea tables, eagerly looking for the arrival of the tea-pots, and we most thoroughly enjoyed the excellent meat tea provided for us by the kindness of Miss Lloyd. It was a great disappointment that she was not able to be with us. The Mothers sent a telegram of greeting to the Rector and to her, and in due course an answer came with return greetings and many regrets at their enforced absence.

After tea, Mr. Hayward said a few words to the Mothers, and then we all dispersed to enjoy ourselves in the grounds until 7 o'clock, when the brakes were ready to take us all home again.

Such a lovely drive we had through the pleasant evening air. The sun went down in red and purple clouds, and the moon came out clear and serene.

The Mothers broke out into gentle singing, while the babies (who behaved like angels all day) murmured a gentle accompaniment and disdained to cry after their long day out.

At 9.30 we drove into Hartshorne again, and the Mothers bade farewell with cheers for the Rector and Mrs. Reade, Miss Lloyd, Miss Gill and Mr. Hayward, and themselves. So ended a most happy and successful day.
