Hymn Stories

Love Divine, All Loves Excelling

Charles Wesley wrote something like six thousand hymns during his lifetime. He spent much of his life on horseback travelling from church to



church, so you might wonder how he accomplished this. A part of the answer is found in the fact that he was naturally gifted —

poetry welled up in him, allowing him to express his deep faith through hymns. Another part of the answer is that he organized himself for his task. He developed a kind of shorthand so that he could quickly jot down ideas as they came to him. He carried note cards in his pocket so that he could record his thoughts even while riding a horse. When he reached his destination, he would transform his rough notes into finished verse.

"Love Divine, All Loves Excelling" is one of Wesley's greatest hymns. The hymn is really a prayer — a prayer to Jesus, who is "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling." It invites Jesus to make his dwelling in us — to visit us with his salvation — to enter our hearts. It invites him to take away our love of sinning — to set our hearts at liberty. It concludes by asking Jesus to finish his new creation (we are his new creation) so that we might be pure and spotless — perfectly restored — ready for heaven.

What a Friend We Have in Jesus

Joseph Scriven was a man acquainted with grief. Born in 1819 in County

Down, Ireland, he aspired as a young man to follow in his f a t h e r 's footsteps as a Royal Marine, but his poor health made that impossible. Then he fell in love



and was engaged to be married, but his fiancée drowned before their wedding could take place.

To put as much distance as possible between himself and that tragedy, Scriven then moved to Canada. While living there, he became engaged again, but his fiancée became ill and died before they could be married. In his grief, Scriven determined to devote himself to a life of service. He was especially known for carrying a saw and cutting firewood for people in need.

Scriven received word that his mother was ill. He couldn't afford to return to Ireland, so he sent his mother a poem in the hope that it would comfort her. The poem began, "What a friend we have in Jesus, all our sins and griefs to bear! What a privilege to carry everything to God in prayer!" He later submitted a copy of his poem to a religious journal, where it was published. A few years later, in 1866, he died.
