

FREE COFFEE MORNING in the Dethick Hall

It's the Post Office coffee morning on the 1st of August and this marks a year since we started this initiative. Back in May 2016 when we had our Church Vision Day we discussed the possibility of reaching out to the community in different ways and it was suggested that we might serve hot drinks to those people in the village who come to the Post Office which was held in the Dethick Hall on a Tuesday morning. So about a year ago I popped in one Tuesday morning and had a chat with Robert Aspinall the sub postmaster. I couldn't believe how welcoming and supportive he was of the idea and we agreed to have a trial session on the first Tuesday in September and we have been running the free coffee morning on the first Tuesday of the month ever since. Initially I was worried about who from the church we could get to help but God works in ways that we don't expect.

Cathy Rogers, who lives at the old Manor House and attends a Catholic church in Coalville, was there as usual and when she heard of the idea of a coffee morning was very keen to be involved so she comes every week and helps to set up, serve drinks and chat to customers. She always comes in her Elizabethan costume which she wears all the time and this a talking point to people who call in and don't live in the village. Her husband Robert brings her breakfast cereal across on a tray at 9.30 so it has become quite a ritual. Pete Southgate comes along to help and he's very good at chatting to people. Bill also takes over the responsibility from me when I'm away on holiday which is a great help.

We have our regular customers who used the Post Office every Tuesday and stop for a drink; it is good to be able to have a chat and get to know the villagers better. Sometimes if people have no time to stop they simply rush in with their parcels and straight out again as they have to get back to work. One couple always called in but would never stay for a drink until one day the machine the postmaster uses for transactions wouldn't connect to the internet and while there were waiting they agreed to have a cup of coffee and now they will stop and have a drink every time. Sometimes we have strangers to the village call in and will stay for a chat. Last time the man from Eon came to read the meter and was pleased to have a break. Robert the postmaster is always pleased to be supplied with cups of tea.

We talk about all sorts of things and I always publicise events at the church and church hall but don't preach to people. Last month we were talking about Heritage Open Days and comparing notes. Cathy and Robert are opening the Manor House on Saturday $9^{\rm th}$ September and I recommend anyone to book a place on one of their guided tours.
