





A train trip to Nottingham (from the church magazine 1903)

WEDNESDAY, August 19th, the day of the Annual Excursion of our Mothers' Meeting, most happily proved a lovely day, though it fell between a dull and cloudy Tuesday and a wet and windy Thursday. The main party, numbering twenty-three, and accompanied by the Rev. J. and Mrs. Talbot, Miss Lloyd, Miss Gill, etc, started from Woodville Station at 8.32 am. for the ancient town of Nottingham. The early morning was cloudy and cool, with occasional rain; the rest of the day could hardly have been finer. From Nottingham Midland Station (at present under repair) the party proceeded to St. Peter's Dining Rooms, close to St. Peter's Church' in order to know when they were to gather for tea; and after buns and lemonade, they dispersed to enjoy the varied attractions of the place, such as the view from the Castle, trips in Steamers on the river Trent, and the special attractions of the weekly Market and the Exhibition :— though a proper sense of responsibility kept most of the party from the dangers of 'Tobogganing' and Waterchutes.' At 3.45 we sat down to a Meat Tea, in a pretty room at the back of the Dining Rooms, when the excellence of the provisions was fully appreciated. A word of praise must here be given to the admirable behaviour of the three youngest members of the party! The Rector and Mrs. Reade and various members of the family had by this time joined us; and the meal ended with speeches from the Rector and Mr. Talbot: the former dwelling, among more important topics, on the tidiness with which our tea was set out and the courtesy and obligingness of those who waited on us; the latter speaking highly of the excellence of the Nottingham shops! The Railway Time-table compelled an early start for Woodville, where we arrived 'tired but happy,' at seven o'clock, after a most delightful trip.
