New CofE guidance on vaccinations

As Covid-19 vaccinations are rolled out across England, the Mission and Public Affairs department has issued a briefing note on vaccines. A Church of England spokesperson said:

"The news of the first vaccine to combat Covid-19 approved for use – hopefully the first of a number - is a moment to give thanks.

"We thank God for the skill, dedication and sheer determination of those, in many countries, who have worked around the clock to deliver this breakthrough which will save many lives, and which offers hope of better times ahead.

"As Christians we have a duty to love our neighbour, to protect the vulnerable and preserve life - so we would urge everyone to take the opportunity to be vaccinated when it is offered.

"And we have a duty to stand up for light and truth - so we urge everyone to resist those spreading fear and misinformation about vaccinations, who seek to harm and not to heal."
