Hello everyone

This coming Thursday is Ascension Day, the day when we remember Jesus returning to his Father and commanding his disciples to wait for the coming of the Holy Spirit. We too are invited to wait, to spend the days between Ascension and Pentecost in prayer for God's Kingdom to come.

Thy Kingdom Come is a global prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray for more people to come to know Jesus. What started in 2016 as an invitation from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York to the Church of England has grown into an international and ecumenical call to each of us to pray for five others, that many more may come to know the love of God in Christ. The context is different this year, and we are more aware than ever just how much the world needs that love today.
