

This week I wanted us to explore the psalms, one in particular, and encourage you to spend more time in this amazing book.



Findmypast offered free access to historical newspapers. Not wanting to miss such an opportunity I searched for items of news that featured Hartshorne. Here are some of the interesting snippets that I found:

### DIED

On Friday morning last, in consequence of a fall from his carriage, aged 57, the Rev. Francis Tunnicliffe, Rector of Hartshorne, Derbyshire. He was highly respected by a numerous body of acquaintance, and will be long and deeply lamented by that flock, which for thirty years had been committed to his pastoral care.
