A thought from Sandra

Fast or Feast?

So Advent is finally here, it's time, if we haven't done so already, to 'deck the halls with boughs of holly' and make all our other preparations for Christmas. It's a time of office parties, singing carols and making sure we've got gifts for everyone we need to buy for. Gifts for children usually feature largely in this as there are so many things which they absolutely need, in order to keep up with their friends. How different it was when my dad was a child. He was born in 1916 and on Christmas Eve, when he and his sisters went to bed, there were no decorations up at all. My grandad would go out to the market, buy a tree, decorate it and fill their stockings. None of the 'must have' toys for them, their stockings contained a sixpence in the toe, followed by a tangerine and some nuts in their shells. There might then be a striped candy stick, and a toy such as a penny whistle or a whip and top. From their parents (as opposed to what Santa had brought), there would have been, maybe, a rag doll for the girls and a small toy car for my dad. They would also be given a selection box each, and that was it.

Advent in those days was nowhere near as frenetic as it is today, for surely, when this season was first instituted by the Church, it wasn't intended as a 'season to be jolly'? but as a time of preparation for the wonderful festival which looked forward to both the first and the second coming of Jesus?

If you would like to think more deeply about the spiritual side of this Advent season, then I have suggested some passages below which might help you.
