## A thought from Sandra

How intently do we actually listen to what God is saying to us, as individuals and as a church?

We might hear his voice in the background, through our Bible readings, spiritual songs, sermons etc, but are they so much background noise? Are we seeking to know what the Lord is saying, in order to improve the way in which we act as His disciples, or do we just enjoy a momentary glow or shrug off a challenge?

The only way we are going to grow in faith is by both listening to God, hearing what He is saying and putting it into practice in our lives - however difficult that might be.
