A thought from Mike

Friends, today we have a guest preacher - Bishop Malcolm (who is the assistant Bishop for Derby Diocese). For a decade he served as the Chief of Staff to John Sentanu - the previous Archbishop of York. Malcolm has a heart for youth and for pioneering - amongst many other aspects of mission and outreach in the Kingdom. On this Sunday we are exploring John 20 where Doubting Thomas 'demands' evidence that Jesus is alive. Jesus, being gracious, gives Thomas that proof. What and who do we doubt?; what evidence in life are we waiting for or being down right stubborn about before we shift or move in our thinking? If we aren't doing that somewhere in our life then we're probably not human!



How easy is it to take our freedom to follow Jesus for granted?

Open Doors shared some distressing news this morning:

At least 32 Christians were tragically killed last Friday (7 April) in an attack by suspected Fulani militants on an internally displaced people (IDP) camp in Benue State, Nigeria. Most of the victims are believed to be women and children. The incident comes amidst widespread attacks across Benue State. This includes an attack on a church in the village of Akenawe on Palm Sunday, in which a young boy was killed and at least three people, including the pastor, were kidnapped. Fulani militants are again believed to be responsible.

Open Doors have released a video entitled **Blessed are those who have nothing but prayer** to highlight the bravery of our persecuted family.

Here is an excerpt

Blessed are those who are scared, but choose to follow Jesus just the same, Blessed are those who are persecuted in Jesus' name. Blessed are the risk-takers, The rebels and the rule-breakers. Blessed are those who have nothing but prayer, For God is always with them And the kingdom is theirs.
