How Times Have Changed!

From Gloucestershire Echo, May 7, 1936

A charge of gaming on the public highway against Frances George Buttle of Withington and Malcolm Ernest Griffin was dismissed. P.C. Cleveland said he was on duty at High Street, Withington on Sunday April 12th when he found defendants playing Pitch and Toss on the village green. The spot where they were playing was about 50 yards from the entrance to the church. Both denied that they were playing for money.

Supt. Hopkins said the youths were very respectable, and he did not wish to press the case. The Police had brought the case on account of the number of complaints they had received of street games on Sundays.
