### How Whit Monday was celebrated in 1903 - from the Parish Magazine June 1903

WHIT MONDAY was a glorious sunny day from morning to evening, with a light breeze blowing, and the afternoon in the Rectory grounds was most enjoyable.

Everyone seemed to come prepared to enjoy themselves, and to be satisfied with everything. A tent was put up in the small field and the Sale of Work was held in it. But the tables were spread under the shadow of the trees, and a large company, men, women, and children, sat down to tea in relays, including the members of the band, whose music constantly enlivened the company throughout the day.

Soon after three o'clock, the Rector, accompanied by Mrs. Reade, Lady Kathleen Bligh, Mrs. Williams, and the other members of the Rectory party and Miss Crewe, entered the tent, and Lady Kathleen Bligh, after a charming speech — in which she expressed her interest in the efforts Hartshorne was making to restore its Parish Church, and referred to her long friend-ship with the Rector, begging all would help this afternoon to reduce the debt on the Church, and so free his mind from anxiety — declared the Sale of Work open.

It proved very successful, and realized £36 11s. 9d., from which sum the expenses will of course have to be deducted.

Our thanks are due to all those who worked so hard, and made so many pretty and useful things for sale.

Many members of the Mothers' Meeting worked and sent in many articles. The Girls Friendly Society members and candidates had a little stall of their own, mostly of their own work, and took just over £2.

We must also thank all those willing helpers at the tea, those who took trays, and those who waited on the company and prepared the tea. All did their part willingly and thoroughly, and the result was a complete success.

A special word of thanks is due to Mr. Parker for bringing his Motor Car, in which he gave twopenny rides and made £1 3s. 0d. for the funds, besides giving an immense amount of pleasure. Some of the children begged him to stay all night! So that they might all get a ride.

After the tea was over dancing began and was kept up to nearly ten o'clock, when the strains of "God save the King" were heard, and a happy and successful day was brought to a conclusion.
