Boy vanishes down 50ft. hidden well

As two seven-year-old boys walked home from school, one vanished from sight. Maurice Stone, of Brookdale Road, Hartshorne, Derbyshire, had fallen down a grass-hidden 50ft. well.

His companion, John Redfern, ran to his home in Station Street, Woodville, and told his father.

A rescue party was quickly organised and Mr. Frederick Hardwick, also of Station Road, was lowered down the well.

Maurice, in bed yesterday, with bruises on head and arms, said: "Mr. Hardwick told me

'Hold on to my breeches lad' and I did. He got me between his knees and we were pulled up.

"When I fell into the well all I could see from the bottom was a spot of light. It was nice to see that, but there was water all round me and I was frightened."
