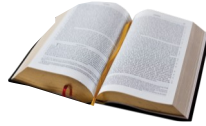

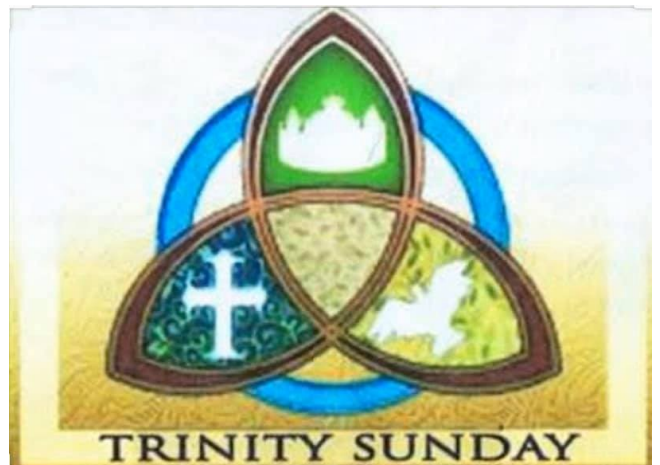
Matthew 28:16-end

HARTSHORNE, DERBYSHIRE.
FREEHOLD PUBLIC HOUSE, COTTAGES, AND LAND.
TO BE SOLD BY AUCTION,
By Mr. LEEDAM,
At the Red Cow Public House, in Harshorne, on **TUESDAY**, the 22nd day of September, 1846, at 5 o'clock in the afternoon, in one Lot or more as may be agreed upon at the time of Sale.
ALL that **FREEHOLD MESSUAGE**, used as a Public House, and known by the sign of the **RED Cow**, with **THREE COTTAGES** and a **CLOSE** of Rich Old **TURF LAND**, called 'Turners Leys, adjoining thereto, containing altogether upwards of Three Acres.
For further particulars apply to Messrs. **RICHARDSON**, Solicitors, **Burton-on-Trent**.
Burton, September 2nd, 1846.

A **messuage** is an archaic term used in property law. A dwelling house together with its outbuildings, cartilage, and the adjacent land appropriated for its use.
