## Bell Ringing Update by Jane Horan

My ringing journey started about 55 years ago when I was a teenager. I lived in the village of Flore, Northamptonshire and went to All Saints Church all through my childhood. Bell ringing was one of the only activities available in the village and I went along to practice nights and rang before the Sunday morning service. I was the youngest member of the team. I learnt to handle a bell and was happy to ring the treble (lightest bell) but I have to say that I never really understand the intricacies of method ringing. At the age of 19 I went away to college and didn't ring again .... UNTIL, in 2013, we got the bells at St Peter's refurbished. I had no intention of ringing but was persuaded to have a go and surprisingly it all came back! Now ten years later I'm still ringing and have learned far more with the guidance of Andy Austen, our Tower Captain, and other experienced ringers than I ever did as a teenager.

Recently we put out a plea for more ringers and I'm pleased to say that Carol James was interested in learning and Betty Hay (who goes to St John's) was really pleased to have a go at ringing again.
