What was school like nearly 150 years ago?

# From the Log-book for Hartshorne Infants and Girls School 1875

Sarah Anne Smith, a certificated mistress, was responsible for teaching the entire school

December 6<sup>th</sup> to December 11<sup>th</sup> Very poor attendance on Monday morning owing to the rough, snowy weather. Mary and Henry Betteridge are still away ill. The Thompsons, Holmeses and others whose homes are at a distance from the school have not been in attendance all the week.

On Thursday morning Mary Henson\* was away from school on account of the illness of her mother.

Fannie Villiers\* was away through illness on Friday afternoon. On Thursday morning she taught the infants a tune to the hymn "While Shepherds watched their flocks by night". The children in the girls' school have this week learned the tune of "Once in royal David's city".

On Friday morning all the children in the girls' room were required to stand for a quarter of an hour, holding a slate above their head, for a punishment for their disorder.

The attendance on account of the weather, also the illness of several of the children has

been very small, and the average attendance for the week is only 92.

Thursday Dec 16th The fourth standard, for a composition exercise, in the morning wrote out an account of the "Ancient Britons". Their grammar is very faulty. Emily V did the best exercise. Joanna R has improved very much in her lessons lately, but her sewing is still very poor. Friday 17th This morning I heard the first standard boys read. The girls are better readers than the boys. John A has forgotten his reading and writing too, through being absent so long. The attendance has been better than last week. Received eight shillings and 10 pence this week for the school fees of the pauper children for the last quarter. Ave number present this week 112. December 20th to 24th Mary Henson was in the girls' school during this week. On Tuesday morning Fannie Villiers gave a lesson to the children on the upper gallery on the "swallow". In the afternoon Mary Henson gave a lesson to the infants on the "Shepherd dog". On Tuesday morning I took the first standard girls for a reading lesson I find that several of them have improved lately. Many of the airls have been away helping their mothers prepare for Christmas. Average number present 103. Christmas Holiday from Dec 24th to Jan 3rd.
