Remembering Pauline

Our dear sister Pauline Insley finally went to be with the Lord last week.

Pauline was one of the first people I met on coming to St Peter's nearly forty years ago.

She was very much involved with the flower arranging and up to about five years ago always made the Easter Garden and helped with the Harvest displays. Pauline was PCC secretary for a number of years and was a member of the choir.

When she was going through a difficult time at work, Pauline gave testimony in church that Jesus spoke to her through the words from the song *In Christ Alone* "From life's first cry to final breath, Jesus commands my destiny." Believing those words gave her the strength to get through that time and it was that belief which underpinned her whole life and her faith.

When her husband Mick started coming to church with her, bringing their grandchildren, it was a very happy time for her. After Mick died suddenly, shortly after retiring, Pauline was incredibly brave — her faith really carried her. Her son Neil and his family used to bring her to church and I know that Pauline felt so blessed when her family made a commitment to Christ. She was so happy to know that her family shared her faith.

Tragically, her daughter Nicole died unexpectedly a few years ago, Pauline had to be so strong once more. Her faith never wavered.

In recent years Pauline had been battling with cancer. With the support of her son Neil, brother Terry and sister-in-law Christine she was able to stay in the home that she loved. Pauline always remained positive, seeing the hand of God in her surroundings. She noticed the little things — birds, flowers, animals, the changing seasons, and she always counted her blessings. Her constant companion was her cat, Tess, who gave her so much joy with her quirky feline antics.

When lockdown happened, sadly Pauline wasn't able to come to church or attend house group anymore. She remained in contact with us through texts, and we supported her through prayer. Here are some words of encouragement that Pauline shared with us:

What heights of love, what depths of peace, When fears are stilled, when strivings cease. My Comforter, my All in All, Here in the love of Christ I stand. (In Christ Alone)

Psalm 91:4 "He will cover you with his feathers and under his wings you will find refuge."
