Our trip along the Staffordshire and Worcestershire Canal

Do you remember I-SPY books? When we our children were young, to keep them occupied on car journeys or when on holiday, they would have an I-spy book to look at and in which to tick off things they had spotted. There were titles such as I-SPY at the seaside, I-SPY in the country and I-SPY on the motorway. Well, I have spent a lot of time over the last two weeks spotting interesting animals, plants and landmarks while out on our canal boat.



Today was a really good day - I would definitely have scored a lot of points! I saw a kingfisher darting across the water—it was an unbelievably vivid blue and the first I have ever seen, a majestic buzzard soaring above trees overhanging the canal and two herons standing

motionless.

We passed an intriguing cave called Devil's Den, which was carved out of the red sandstone rocks in 1770 as a boat house but is now used as a bat nesting site. We've been through two short tunnels, one of which has houses perched precariously above it.
