THE EXCITEMENT OF GOOSEBERRIES

The Egton Bridge Old Gooseberry Society holds its annual show on the first Tuesday in August. It is is a very serious affair. Established in 1800, competitors can enter a variety of classes and each class has its own sub divisions for the different colours of gooseberry - red, yellow, green or white. The classes are: heaviest berry, heaviest berry twins, heaviest dozen berries.

Weighing of the berries is extremely tense. When Sean and I visited the show (we'd gone expecting a country fair), I asked a question of one of the people overseeing the exhibits. He suggested I went into the weighing room and asked a particular person there. I went where directed and found a room in silence. I quietly asked someone where I could find the man I'd



been sent to see. The entire room (all men) turned to me and whispered loudly HUSH! It turned out one of the berries was being weighed!

Once the weight had been announced (in drams*) everyone was very friendly and helpful but I still don't know why such complete silence is needed for the actual weighing.
