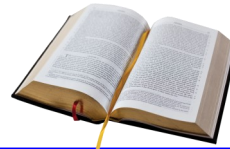

Psalm 1

A thought from Mike

The commentators say this about Psalm 1: 'Psalm 1 is called a wisdom psalm because we learn that happiness results from our choice to follow God's direction of life. In this psalm the writer sets forth two ways or two directions in life. One is **the right way that leads to happiness**, and the other is the wrong way that leads to misery....'

But what do we mean by happiness? - as it's an emotion that is often fleeting. It comes and it goes without warning. What it is that Psalm 1 is urging us to seek after? What is it that the Lord calls us to daily strive for?

Pastoral Reorganisation
-Update

As you will hopefully remember, last year we mentioned that the church of England were making ministerial changes, and we made you aware that we would not be having our own vicar.

To align with this, the 4 local Anglican churches have the opportunity to change.

Over the last few months there has been consultation on-going to look at how it could work.

There were four options discussed at the 4 PCC's....

1. We cease being four parishes and become one parish and one benefice. We have one PCC over four churches.
2. We go from four individual parish churches in three benefices, to remaining four individual parish churches but become one benefice called Swadlincote Minster and every church keeps its PCC.
3. We continue with an informal group (with no legal structures or legal ties) locally called Swadlincote Minster. However, one of the current local paid clergy (of incumbent status) would then be asked by Libby to be licensed as priest in charge of Hartshorne and Emmanuel, whilst still retaining their present post.
4. Is there something else that nobody has thought of?

Following on from our last PCC meeting, the consensus is that we go with option 2.

Also, the general feeling across the other 3 Minster churches is similar...

*1 Benefice and 4 Parishes
(so permanently joined together, but everyone keeps their own PCC)*

Benefice meaning: - In the CofE this describes any parish or group of parishes under a single stipendiary minister (Vicar)

The plan being if we are happy, is that when we meet in March as a PCC, there will be an opportunity to ask questions (pre-sent) and seek clarity if required, to enable a formal PCC vote in our own group to establish if we are happy to proceed with option 2.
